# AHRQ SOPS Program

- Started in 2001
- AHRQ's response to the IOM's report "To Err is Human" that called for healthcare organizations to establish a culture of patient safety

# What is Patient Safety Culture?

- Day-to-day operating principles around patient safety that tell organizational members:
  - How they should behave
  - What is expected & rewarded
  - What is disciplined & what is not

**“The way things are done around here”**

**The “personality” of the organization around patient safety**

# Purposes of the SOPS Surveys

- Raise staff awareness about patient safety
- Diagnose and assess the current status of patient safety culture
- Identify strengths and areas for patient safety culture improvement
- Examine trends in patient safety culture change over time
- Evaluate the cultural impact of patient safety initiatives and interventions
- Conduct internal and external comparisons

# Overview of the SOPS Surveys

## Hospital SOPS

- Released November 2004

## Nursing Home SOPS

- Released September 2008

## Medical Office SOPS

- Released January 2009

## Pharmacy Services SOPS

- Anticipated release in 2012

### Survey development steps:

1. Literature Review
2. Background Interviews
3. Cognitive Testing
4. Pilot Test
5. Psychometric Analysis
6. Finalize survey
7. Release of survey along with toolkit materials

# Overview of AHRQ SOPS

- Hospital
  - Intended for all hospital staff, including physicians
- Medical Office
  - Designed for a single medical office in a specific location (not a medical office building)
- Nursing Home
  - Not intended for use in assisted living facilities, community care facilities, or independent living facilities

- 12 dimensions
- 2 overall questions
- 42 total questions
- Available in Spanish

- 2 overall questions
- 51 total questions

# Survey Modifications

- We do not recommend modifying the survey
- However, work areas and staff positions can be customized for your facility
  - To submit to the comparative database, crosswalk your work areas and staff positions to the original AHRQ survey categories
- When necessary, you may add questions to the *end* of the survey, before the background questions
- Do *not* remove single survey items (when necessary remove all items in a composite)
